总体情况：

《美国公民自由联盟档案》缩微胶卷共计358卷，目前已完成：

- 模转数处理：120卷，计约14万5千张图片，占总数1/3
- 完成建库：
 - ✓ 胶卷：20卷，约2万5千张图片，7个专题
 - ✓ 数据记录：完成1305条，大约占全部的1/6至1/7
(项目立项为完成数据记录269条，共4个专题，10卷胶卷)。
- 平台发布：校内直接浏览、检索、下载全文，校外访问实现浏览、检索及CASHL文献传递功能，提供目录导航，统计功能等.....

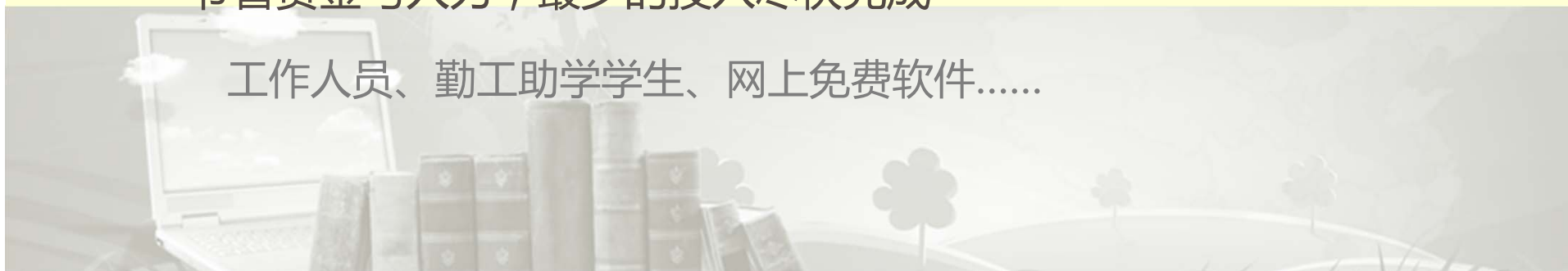

1、平台选择

- 参考CASHL大型特藏分散加工规范
- 参考《纸质档案数字化技术规范》 DA/T 31-2005
- 我馆现有特色库平台，可以满足建库要求，集数据加工、资源建设、管理、发布、检索与服务等功能于一体，采用国际元数据标准，支持元数据统一收割，数字对象分布存放，支持文档、图片、多媒体等文件格式

guiding them to extra work in English; discovering where the high-school curriculum is weak; finding ways to supplement it; directing outstanding students to preparatory schools.

This is deemed to be highly important in order to maximize the chances for selecting the most promising candidates who, in turn would be recommended to organizations with funds for scholarships. Such assistance will tend to reduce the likelihood of failures and drop-outs, and to insure the very best use of limited resources.

2) Placement: relating students to the colleges. This means discovering with students their particular needs and interests; assisting them in securing scholarships (helping with applications, preparation for examinations) advising on the details of travel, clothes, college life; working with families and home communities to develop better understanding of "going to college."

3) Counselling: especially during college years. This means knowing thoroughly the background and needs of the many Indian communities; giving academic guidance as especially related to individual experience and future job or professional possibilities; helping to secure supplementary income in college through additional grants or part-time work; establishing connections with other students, with families, churches in the school community; keeping the way always open for personal consultation.

4) Accumulating expert knowledge: this means that counsellors and Board acquire an expertness in the field which would give them authority in reviewing requirements of Indian scholarships; establishing policies in relation to standard tests; drawing attention to achievements rather than failure; reducing pressures on the student as an "Indian;" intelligently criticising educational opportunities for Indians at high school and grade school level.

5) Consulting with tribes: both regarding using their resources for scholarship assistance and as to procedures for selection of students and follow-up.

6) Developing funds: this means counsellors and Board continuously working with high schools, camps, church groups, college and national organizations to maintain and increase available funds; making full use of present resources which lead to increases; when and if necessary, spearheading a concerted drive for increased funds, public and/or private.

THE PROJECT

In the development of an Independent School and College Counselling Service for Indian Youth, the Sub-Committee on Indian Education sees three phases. It is recommended that action be undertaken immediately by the Coordinating Committee to secure funds to underwrite the first phase.

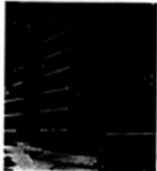

M-REIT CONTINUES RAPID DEVELOPMENT . . .

Thanks to your splendid participation we are now a fine family of nearly 6,500 shareholders of a Trust owning nine apartment houses. We can take pride that we are achieving significant integration in all our buildings — underscored by the fact that *ALTHOUGH NO QUOTAS ARE USED*, 54% of all our vacancies have been rented to Negro tenants. This percentage should decline as special efforts are made initially to inform the Negro community the buildings are now open. All our buildings are located in good residential neighborhoods, but in areas closed by de facto segregation. We are simultaneously fulfilling our investment and social objectives.

Shareholders will receive on July 31, 1968 M-REIT's sixth consecutive distribution, continuing our 3% return, tax-free due to "bookkeeping" depreciation allowances. This is equal to almost 5% for taxpayers in the 1/3 bracket.

The April issue of "Housing Month," in discussing profits in real estate notes, "tax savings: most, if not all of the earnings can be shielded from income tax because of liberal depreciation and other expense allowances on income-producing property. Depreciation, while deductible, is not a cash outflow item — so, after all "expenses," before tax earnings can equal after-tax earnings." Dear Mr. Reitman:

Attached please find the final parts of a "verification package". ACLU, and either Mr. Neier or you, should now have all the materials listed as part of the verification package. Some of them were also listed as part of a late-May filing with EEOC (and copy to ACLU) charging retaliation on top of the prior charges filed.

I have not yet been able to finish the cover materials which complete the retaliation package, documenting the range and variety of retaliation items which have been part of the on-going pattern to suppress and delay a "proper day in court" for the "creation of racial extremism at National SER". Denial of justice, and of civil rights and liberties, should be becoming visible from the materials provided.

Do you understand my reasons for using certified mail, and keeping Mr. Neier in the communications loop? Over the past eight years I have been systematically testing out premises, hypotheses, and educated guesses relating to racism in America, and racial problems, imbalance, cleavages, separatism, reverse discrimination, reasons for the relative lack of progress in closing the racial inequality gaps...

This individual research program attempts to be systematic and documented, and it: (1) involves considerable testing, mainly systems-testing, but also leader-testing, values-testing, etc., and (2) the increasing probability of publicity and publication in coming months. Certified mail documentation, and communication through top leaders, is essential. Emphatically, please, this does not imply distrust, or a lack of respect for anyone's qualities. Systematic documentation.

Perhaps, from the national reputation of the American Civil Liberties Union, and my perception of ACLU's importance, I created some unduly high expectations. However I had expected during 3½ months to see more occur, and be further along. Hasn't there been relatively little visible action, substantive response, or verifiable results from ACLU during the weeks and months?

I am hopeful this will change shortly, and you may even have material in the mail now. Have you received good response yet from National SER - I have neither seen nor "been confronted with" anything to date (especially through ACLU).

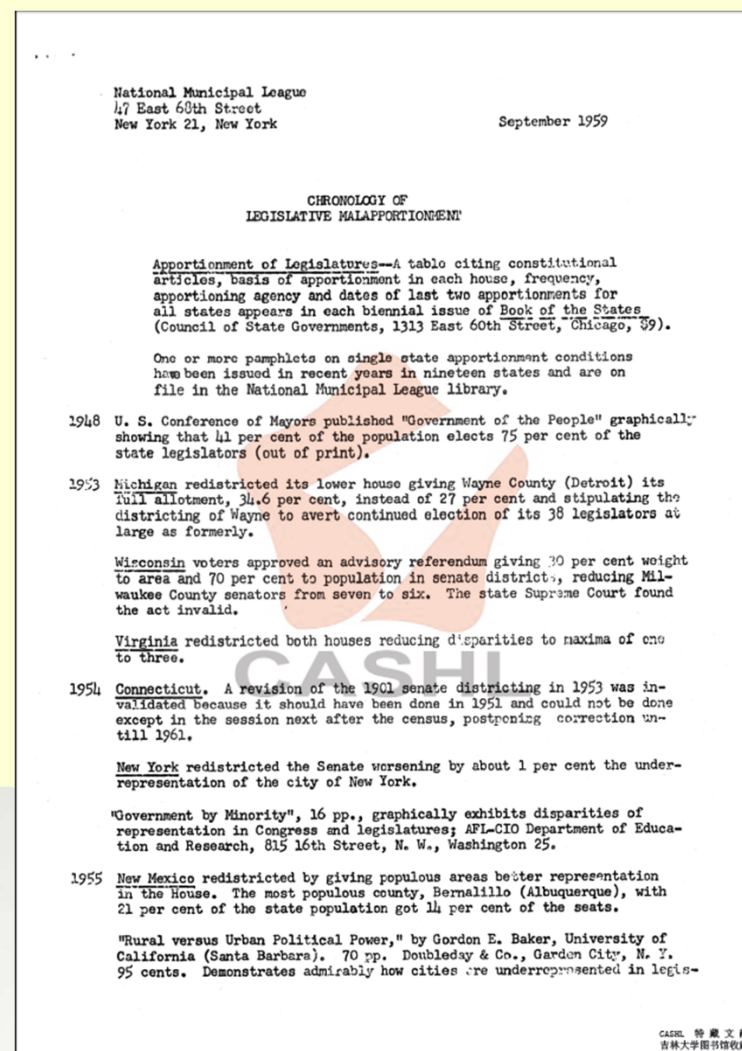
